Notes: Tabulations are based on categories listed in the 2018 American Community Survey Data 5-year sample. Data Obtained from IPUMS at the University of Minnesota Population Center. Weighted for sampling distribution on 52,706 persons. All tabulations show the distribution of persons, so as to reflect differential household size.

Foreign Born are those born outside the United States, Puerto Rico, and other US territories. “Weaker English” includes those who speak no English and those who are reported to speak English, “but not well”. “In Poverty” includes those who fall below the poverty line, as recorded in the Census ACS data. Uninsured is recorded for those who report “No health insurance coverage”, government or private. “Dwellings 3+ HH” includes persons resident within structures that are a “3-4 family building” or larger.

Population Groups are derived from the Cross-Classification of Census Race and Census Spanish Origin variables. “Non-Hispanic Whites” are those who report race as White and not to be of Spanish Origin” Persons of Color are all others, including those who report themselves to be “Hispanic” of any race; and those who report themselves to be Black, Asian, Native-American, “Other Race”, or of “Two or more races”.
